# Introduction

The challenges faced by international students are have a higher likelihood of experiencing isolation, exploitation and extortion. These risks were consid COVID-19 with few Australian government safety is holders.

With international students unable to return home over the Summer break, Australian domestic borders in various lockdowns, NSW citzens movements restricted, and limited opportunities for part-time work, it was imperative that Arc and UNSW work together to ensure all students are supported and socialised. To mitigate these potential harms, the UNSW international student community was invited to participate in FUNNER SUMMER.

Funner Summer was a series of direct social activities, peer facilitated activities and support mechanisms that were designed to engage this vulnerable cohort. The program featured trips and tours in Sydney and greater NSW; sport classes; volunteering opportunities; discounted groceries; additional pastoral care resources and more. Where possible, the Funner Summer was facilitated by current UNSW students whose lived experience in capturing their peers interests, communication style and passions was critical to the program's success.

Over 5 weeks, students participated in Funner Summer activities over 8600 times across over 180 different events. Funner Summer was only possible thanks to the generous financial contribution of UNSW and the agility of the UNSW student organisation Arc to rapidly activate a range of activities.

### Connection

International students were invited to join Summer Friends' messaging groups on WhatsApp. The groups were popular and served their purpose of connecting eager students. Indeed, they created additional opportunities for more organic connections to be made as students took the initiative to create their own special interest groups. Across the 2 main groups there were over 500 students.

### Support


Where students were identified as particularly vulnerable, Arc leveraged existing expertise and capabilities in pastoral care, primary interventions and secondary support. Food Hub infrastructure was able to be used over the break including the provision of "holiday hampers". Food Hub was able to enhance its service to students by additionally handing out activity passes to students. These passes meant that students would be able to socialise at their leisure, rather than be beholden to Arc scheduling. Students were grateful for the flexibility and generosity of these passes.




